basic FISHING guidelines

NATIVE FISH of the SATILLA RIVER

With 32 species of fish that represent 36 families, the Satilla is a great river to fish. Woodhouse is only 14 miles upstream from the ocean, which makes it possible to catch both freshwater and saltwater fish. It is one of the premier Redfish and Striped Bass rivers in the Southeast.

Traveling through this area in the late 1770s, William Bartram illustrated the Redfish and noted a "It is a fish of prodigious strength and activity in the water; is wanted in a gizzard more of itself, and gives no space to small fish, which he preys upon."

local species

LARGEMOUTH BASS (*Micropterus salmoides*)
This game-fishing fish is the most common in the river. It is a voracious feeder, feeding on small fish, insects, and other aquatic life. It is a popular game fish and is found throughout the river.

SMALLMOUTH BASS (*Micropterus dolomieu*)
This species is found in the river and is a popular game fish. It is a voracious feeder, feeding on small fish, insects, and other aquatic life.

ROCKBASS (*Ambloplites rupestris*)
This species is found in the river and is a popular game fish. It is a voracious feeder, feeding on small fish, insects, and other aquatic life.

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how to measure a fish

- Place the fish flat on its side with the line straight.
- Hold the fish by the head and tail.
- Measure to a straight line from the tip of the snout to the extreme tip of the tail.
- You must always use the longest line that can be used to measure the length of the fish.

Florida Largemouth Bass	5 per day	10 inches
Crayfish	5 per day	10 inches
Clayton	5 per day	10 inches
